




Year 10 Handbook




- The handbook provides important College information which supports your choices

Students who are looking for the VCE-VM pathway for their studies in Year 11 2024 are encouraged to begin a VET sequence in Year 10. <u>Note: School attendance of 85% or above is required to access VET courses.</u>

Electives and Backups must be listed in order of preference. You must select four Backups. Every effort will be made to give students their preferences. Programs will be checked to ensure that students have selected at least one unit of Science and one unit of Humanities for Year 10 and at least 1 unit of Arts and Technology across Year 9 and 10. VET & Early Access VCE units count as TWO electives.


Early Access VCE – Year 10



- Not for everyone
- Only for students with excellence attendance (85% or higher) and 'at or above' standard in English
- Enables students to potentially complete a Year 12 subject early
- Gives a better understanding of the requirements of VCE
- If interested in studying an Early Access Unit they **MUST** consult with course counsellors and the teachers of the relevant subjects.
 - students should also seek out the appropriate KLD leaders to obtain further information about undertaking a VCE subject and what to expect in that subject.
 - They will also need to get a recommendation from their current teacher in that Learning Area before their request will be considered.

VET Delivered to Secondary Students (VDSS)



- Warragul Regional College offers students access to a wide variety of VET (Vocational Education and Training) courses which appeal to different interests and careers pathways. VET programs can combine with either VCE, VCE VM and provide the opportunity for vocational training and experience in the workplace.
- VET subjects may be studied at your school, in partnership with another school, or through an external Registered Training Organisation such as a TAFE.
- VET certificates take 1 or 2 years to complete.














BENEFITS OF VET





- VET is learning which is directly related to work. Nationally recognised qualifications are developed by industry to give people the knowledge and skills they need to work
- The courses are 'competency-based' which means you achieve your qualification by demonstrating that you have the knowledge and can perform the skills at the industry standard.
- Some VET courses have an exam and can contribute to your ATAR these are called 'scored' VET subjects.
- Other VET subjects are 'unscored' so are not calculated in the ATAR.
 - Can make you more job ready but still keep the University options
 open

KEY POINTS YOU NEED TO UNDERSTAND ABOUT VET ENROLMENT





- Your VET studies should be directly relevant to your planned career/study pathway and clearly stated on the VET expression of interest form
- Don't do VET just to see if you like it or because a friend is doing it.
- Remember completing VET courses is a privilege not a right!
- There is a written/theory component to each VET course that must be passed no course is all practical!
- If you are accepted you will attend 1 day per week (usually Wednesday) and will miss a day at school, which will require you to catch up on this work.



KEY POINTS YOU NEED TO UNDERSTAND ABOUT VET ENROLMENT



- Final confirmation of courses running will be known by mid October after all enrolment numbers are collated.
- The Orientation Day for all new VET students is Wednesday 15th November
- Students may withdraw from their VET course prior to the 4th week of the year.



KEY POINTS YOU NEED TO UNDERSTAND ABOUT VET ENROLMENT



- Your attendance at school must be excellent to be eligible to undertake a VET course and there must be a recommendation from your Year Level Advocate.
- Each training provider sets a minimum number of students enrolled to ensure a course runs generally 10 therefore you may need a back up course.
- Some courses might be oversubscribed so you may not automatically get in – you might be asked to provide additional evidence to support your application.



COSTS/TRANSPORT





- Families are responsible for paying for VET uniforms/PPE
- Schools are responsible for the VET tuition costs and some of the VET materials costs



 Transport from Moe and Morwell train stations via bus to Tafe Gippsland campuses will be provided to students free of charge.




How to Express Interest in VET for 2024

Talk to the VET providers here tonight









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- Read the VET Handbook and decide on your VET course
- Submit an expression of interest-available at course selection
- Students must obtain a Unique Student Identifier (USI)
- All VET applicants will be reviewed by WRC staff to • determine suitability



Summary of important points



- Read the Handbook carefully & watch videos
 - Choose electives that interests you and might be an area for future pathways
 - Actively listen and ask questions in the Curriculum Expo
 - Use CARE group time, your Career Action Plan and your Morrisby survey to investigate and ask questions
 - Discuss with Parents/Guardians
 - Please listen to your student when they discuss and create a pros and cons list
 - Avoid choosing elective units because your friends have chosen it, it's about you.
